

KUYPJ Students Describe Johor Govt's Initiatives As Meeting Living Cost Needs

including the Bangsa Johor Scholarship and Johor Student Laptop Assistance, for those eligible, Premium Maju Johor WiFi Service, IPT Registration Assistance, and Johor Child Student Incentives are provided to all students. Students and lecturers at Kolej Universiti Yayasan Pelajaran Johor (KUYPJ) welcomed the Johor government's RM5.76 million allocation to improve the institution's infrastructure and learning environment. Students said free campus WiFi helps reduce monthly internet costs, while the Johor Child Student Incentive eases daily expenses and motivates them to focus on their studies. They also believe the initiatives support KUYPJ's goal of achieving university status by 2029. Lecturers described the development allocation as a strategic investment that will strengthen the institution's learning ecosystem through improved facilities such as smart classrooms, laboratories and sports infrastructure. They said the upgrades will enhance academic excellence, student well-being and graduate employability by supporting industry-based learning. The allocation includes RM3.8 million to upgrade the School of Hospitality and Tourism, RM1.5 million to strengthen digital infrastructure, RM200,000 for hall and studio upgrades, and RM263,000 to improve the football field, recreational facilities and sports infrastructure.
